FROM CAREGIVER TO FUTURE DOCTOR The Story of Solomon John



Today we are featuring the story of Solomon John, a very humble and polite boy.

He first stepped through the gates of Echoes of Mercy Christian School as a very little boy on January 7, 2015, ready for playgroup. That day marked the beginning of twelve years of steady support, love, and second chances that would shape his young life.

Solomon is the second-born in a family of two boys. His older brother once sat for the secondary school summative examination and earned an impressive B-, a grade that should have opened university doors. But the fees were beyond reach, and the dream quietly folded away.

At home, the real weight rests on Solomon's narrow shoulders. It began long ago, in 2007, when his father woke one morning to a nightmare etched into his own body: the flesh on his palm had mysteriously vanished. What started as shock soon turned into a slow, cruel decline. Within a month, weakness crept through his limbs. Two months later, his legs swelled painfully, wounds opened across them, and he could no longer walk. The once-strong man became bedridden, his body wasting away as energy drained.

His mother, a woman of unbreakable spirit, rises before dawn each day. She is the sole breadwinner, standing at market stalls selling maize on behalf of vendors, surviving on the small commissions she earns. Every shilling is carefully divided: medicine for her husband to ease his pain, food to keep her boys growing, school fees so Solomon can keep learning. She never complains. She simply keeps going, her love a quiet, fierce force that holds the family together.



Solomon is now in Grade 9, the senior class in junior secondary. Next year he will transition to senior school—a milestone that fills him with both excitement and quiet fear.

Yet in the midst of all this, Solomon carries a bright, burning dream. He wants to become a doctor. Not just any doctor—he wants to understand exactly what stole his father's strength and health. He wants to find answers, to heal others caught in the same mysterious suffering, to turn pain into purpose.

Through every challenge, Solomon has never walked alone. Echoes of Mercy has stood with him—providing education, encouragement, meals, and a place to belong—for twelve long years. Today, he looks back with deep gratitude.

With a heart full of emotion, Solomon says:
